25 agapao (ag-ap-ah'-o); perhaps from agan (much) [or compare 5689]; to love (in a social or moral sense): KJV-- (be-) love (-ed). Compare 5368. **[T]** agapao- 1) used of persons: to welcome, to entertain, to be fond of, to love dearly 2) used of things: to be well pleased, to be contented at or with a thing.

1063 gar (gar); a primary particle; properly, assigning a reason (used in argument, explanation or intensification; often with other particles): KJV-- and, as, because (that), but, even, for, indeed, no doubt, seeing, then, therefore, verily, what, why, yet. **[T]** gar- for.

2316 theos (theh'-os); of uncertain affinity; a deity, especially (with 3588) the supreme Divinity; figuratively, a magistrate; by Hebraism, very: KJV-- X exceeding, God, god [-ly, -ward]. **[T]** theos-1) a god or goddess, a general name of deities or divinities 2) the Godhead, the trinity a) God the Father, the first Person in the trinity b) Christ, the second Person of the trinity c) Holy Spirit, the third Person in the trinity 3) spoken of the only and true God a) refers to the things of God b) His counsels, interests, things due to Him 4) whatever can in any respect be likened unto God, or resemble Him in any way, God's representative or viceregent of magistrates and judges.

3779 houto (hoo'-to); or (before a vowel) houtos (hoo'-toce); adverb from 3778; in this way (referring to what precedes or follows): KJV-- after that, after (in) this manner, as, even (so), for all that, like (-wise), no more, on this fashion (-wise), so (in like manner), thus, what. **[T]** houto or (before a vowel) houtos- in this manner, thus, so.

1 A a (al'-fah); of Hebrew origin; the first letter of the alphabet; figuratively, only (from its use as a numeral) the first: KJV-- Alpha. Often used (usually an, before a vowel) also in composition (as a contraction from 427) in the sense of privation; so, in many words, beginning with this letter; occasionally in the sense of union (as a contraction of 260). **[T]** a- 1) the first letter of the Greek alphabet 2) Christ is the Alpha to indicate that He is the beginning (and the end).

2 Aaron (ah-ar-ohn'); of Hebrew origin [175]; Aaron, the brother of Moses: KJV-- Aaron. [T] Aaron,-Aaron = "light-bringer." The brother of Moses, the first high priest.

3 Abaddon (ab-ad-dohn'); of Hebrew origin [11]; a destroying angel: KJV-- Abaddon. **[T]** Abaddon-Abaddon = "destruction." 1) ruin 2) destruction 3) the place of destruction 4) the name of the angel-prince of the infernal regions, the minister of death and the author of havoc on the earth.

4 abares (ab-ar-ace'); from 1 (as a negative particle) and 922; weightless, i.e. (figuratively) not burdensome: KJV--from being burdensome. **[T]** abares- 1) not burdensome 2) not heavy 3) light, without weight.

5 Abba (ab-bah'); of Aramaic origin [2]; father (as a vocative case): KJV-- Abba. [T] Abba- Abba = "father." Father, the customary title used of God in prayer (Father). Whenever it occurs in the New Testament it has the Greek interpretation joined to it, that is apparently to be explained by the fact that the Chaldee (Aramaic) "ABBA" through frequent use in prayer, gradually acquired the nature of a most sacred proper name, to which the Greek-speaking Jews added the name from their own tongue.

6 Abel (ab'-el); of Hebrew origin [1893]; Abel, the son of Adam: KJV-- Abel. **[T]** Abel- Abel = "vanity (that is, transitory)." The second son of Adam, murdered by his brother, Cain.

7 Abia (ab-ee-ah'); of Hebrew origin [29]; Abijah, the name of two Israelites: KJV-- Abia. **[T]** Abia- Abijah = "my father is Jah (Jehovah) Yah (Yahweh)." 1) a priest, the head of a priestly family from whom when David divided the priests into 24 classes, Abia was the 8th order 2) the son and successor to Rehoboam upon the throne of Judah.

8 Abiathar (ab-ee-ath'-ar); of Hebrew origin [54]; Abiathar, an Israelite: KJV--Abiathar. **[T]** Abiathar-Abiathar = "father of abundance." The name of a high priest.

9 Abilene (ab-ee-lay-nay'); of foreign origin [compare 58]; Abilene, a region of Syria: KJV-- Abilene. **[T]** Abilene- Abilene = "grassy meadow." A region of Syria between Lebanon and Hermon toward Phoenicia, 18 miles (29 km) from Damascus and Heliopolis in a remarkable gorge called "Suk Wadi Barada." A local

tradition (based on the Koran) states that Cain buried his brother Abel here, whose tomb is shown in a rock.

10 Abioud (ab-ee-ood'); of Hebrew origin [31]; Abihud, an Israelite: KJV-- Abiud. **[T]** Abioud- Abiud = "my father is majesty." The son of Bela and grandson of Benjamin (1 Chr. 8:3).

11 Abraam (ab-rah-am'); of Hebrew origin [85]; Abraham, the Hebrew patriarch: KJV-- Abraham. [In Acts 7:16 the text should probably read Jacob.] **[T]** Abraam- Abraham = "father of a multitude." The son of Terah and the founder of the Jewish nation.

12 abussos (ab'-us-sos); from 1 (as a negative particle) and a variation of 1037; depthless, i.e. (specially) (infernal) "abyss": KJV-- deep, (bottomless) pit. **[T]** abussos- 1) bottomless 2) unbounded 3) the abyss a) the pit b) the immeasurable depth c) of Orcus, a very deep gulf or chasm in the lowest parts of the earth used as the common receptacle of the dead and especially as the abode of demons.

13 Agabos (ag'-ab-os); of Hebrew origin [compare 2285]; Agabus, an Israelite: KJV-- Agabus. **[T]** Agabos- Agabus = "locust." A Christian prophet.

14 agathoergeo (ag-ath-er-gheh'-o); from 18 and 2041; to work good: KJV-- do good. **[T]** agathoergeo- to work good, to do good, to do well, to act rightly.

15 agathopoieo (ag-ath-op-oy-eh'-o); from 17; to be a well-doer (as a favor or a duty): KJV-- (when) do good (well). **[T]** agathopoieo- 1) to do good, to do something which profits others a) to be a good help to someone b) to do someone a favor c) to benefit 2) to do well, to do right. At Sparta, this was the name of the five oldest knights who went on missions for the state.

16 agathopoiia (ag-ath-op-oy-ee'-ah); from 17; well-doing, i.e. virtue: KJV-- well-doing. **[T]** agathopoiiaa course of right action, well-doing, virtue.

17 agathopoios (ag-ath-op-oy-os'); from 18 and 4160; a well-doer, i.e. virtuous: KJV-- them that do well. **[T]** agathopoios- acting rightly, doing well, virtuous.

18 agathos (ag-ath-os'); a primary word; "good" (in any sense, often as noun): KJV-- benefit, good (-s, things), well. Compare 2570. **[T]** agathos- 1) of good constitution or nature 2) useful, salutary 3) good, pleasant, agreeable, joyful, happy 4) excellent, distinguished 5) upright, honorable.

19 agathosune (ag-ath-o-soo'-nay); from 18; goodness, i.e. virtue or beneficence: KJV-- goodness. **[T]** agathosune- uprightness of heart and life, goodness, kindness.
